FIFTY FIRST CONVOCATION  
11<sup>th</sup> May, 2009

It gives me great pleasure to welcome you all on the occasion of the fifty first convocation of the International Institute for Population Sciences, (IIPS) Mumbai. The Institute has completed 53 years of its glorious existence. We commemorated the year 2006 as the Golden Jubilee year of the Institute. I am happy to report the activities of the International Institute for Population Sciences, Mumbai for the academic year 2008-2009.

The Institute attained Deemed University status in 1985. As a Deemed University, the Institute started awarding its own Ph. D. degree since 1986. So far the Institute has awarded Ph.D. degrees to 158 students including 11 foreign students. This year 13 students are receiving Ph.D. degree. From the academic year 1988-89, the Institute started a one-year degree course leading to the Master of Population Studies (MPS) and so far the Institute has awarded the MPS degree to 328 students. Since 1994-95, the MPS course has also been introduced through distance learning, keeping in view the increasing demand for training in the field of Population Studies. So far 182 students have been awarded MPS degree through distance learning. From the academic year 2002-2003, the Institute has started the degree course in Master of Philosophy (M. Phil.) in Population Studies. So far 149 students have been awarded the M. Phil. degree in Population Studies.

The Institute since its inception in 1956, was conducting a one-year certificate programme, Certificate in Population Studies (CPS), for trainees from various countries in Asia and the Pacific region. The course was funded initially by the UNESCAP and later on by the UNFPA. Over the years, through this course the Institute has helped in the training of

personnel from various countries of Asia and the Pacific region and our alumni currently occupy key positions in the field of population, health and development in government departments and universities in these countries and in international organizations. From the academic year 1991-92 this programme was re-designated as Diploma in Population Studies (DPS). So far 1168 students from 42 countries around the world have received CPS/DPS certificate/diploma from this Institute. In this convocation five students, four Indian students and one foreign student will be receiving their diploma. Two tables given in Appendix I furnish country-wise and year-wise number of students who have so far participated in the different teaching programmes of the Institute. From the academic year 2006-07, the Institute has extended its Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) programme through distance learning programme.

The one-year Diploma course in Health Education (DHE), started from August 1987 was renamed during the academic year 2001-2002 as Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE). So far 388 students have been awarded Diploma in Health Promotion Education including 27 foreign students. In this convocation 20 students will be receiving their diploma in DHPE. From academic year 2006-07, the Institute has initiated a new programme, Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH). This course is of fifteen months duration. Five of the first batch students will be awarded diploma in this convocation. The courses, viz., DHPE and PGDCH are conducted by the Family Welfare

Training and Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai which is affiliated to IIPS, Mumbai.

## ACTIVITIES OF THE INSTITUTE DURING THE YEAR 2008-2009

### I. TEACHING PROGRAMME

#### Regular courses

During the year 2008-09, the Institute offered the following five regular courses:- (a) Diploma in Population Studies (DPS), (b) Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE), (c) Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH), (d) Master of Population Studies (MPS), and (e) Master of Philosophy in Population Studies (M.Phil.). Apart from the above regular courses, the Institute also offers Master of Population Studies (MPS) and Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) through distance learning.

The lists of students enrolled for all courses and those who are receiving Degrees/ Diplomas in this convocation are given in Appendix II.

#### a. Diploma in Population Studies (DPS)

The duration of the DPS course is one year, with two semesters. The major emphasis of the diploma course is on imparting technical skills in population analysis and making the students competent in handling and interpreting population data. In the academic year 2008-09 five students were admitted to the Diploma programme. All of them have completed the course successfully.

Dr. K.C. Das is the Co-ordinator for the DPS programme.

#### b. Diploma in Health Promotion Education (DHPE)

This course is of one-year duration. During the current academic year, 20 students were on the rolls in the course of Diploma in Health Promotion Education. The Family Welfare Training and Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai, conducts the course under the auspices of IIPS.

Dr. Sumita Ghosh is the Co-ordinator for the DHPE programme.

#### c. Post Graduate Diploma in Community Healthcare (PGDCH)

This course is of fifteen months duration. It is a new initiative started in academic year 2006-2007. The Family Welfare Training and Research Centre (FWTRC), Mumbai, conducts the course under the auspices of IIPS. Five students were enrolled for this programme and all of them have completed the course successfully. Dr. Sumita Ghosh is the Co-ordinator of this programme.

#### d. Master of Population Studies (MPS)

The duration of this course is one year. Holders of a Master's Degree from recognised universities in the relevant social science subjects including statistics and mathematics are eligible for admission to this course. During the current academic year, 32 students were admitted to MPS/ M. Phil. course. All of them are recipients of a Government of India fellowship. This academic year 19 students will be awarded the MPS degree.

Dr. S. K. Singh is the Co-ordinator for the MPS programme.

**e. Master of Philosophy in Population Studies (M. Phil.)**

From the academic year 2003-04, an opportunity has been offered where the students of the MPS course can opt for M. Phil. in Population Studies after further study for a period of six months. Thus, the total duration of this course is of eighteen months. Last academic year, fourteen students were admitted to the M. Phil. course. Five of them were recipients of the Government of India fellowship. Two of them were recipients of JRF by the University Grants Commission and seven students were recipients of a UNICEF fellowship. Appendix III (Table C) provides the list of M. Phil. Students with their Dissertations.

Dr. S.K.Singh is the Co-ordinator for the M. Phil. programme.

**f. Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.) in Population Studies**

The Institute has well qualified faculty members to guide students for Ph. D. degrees. Students are admitted to the Ph. D. programme on a highly competitive basis. First, they are short-listed based on their academic record. They are then asked to present their proposed study. Based on their performance in the proposal presentation, students are admitted to the Ph. D. programme.

Currently 78 students are registered for the Ph. D programme at the Institute. Of them, 17 are recipients of the Government of India Research Fellowship, 5 are recipients of the UGC Fellowship and the remaining 56 are registered without

fellowship. Appendix II –b provides the list of Ph. D. students registered in the Institute. During the year 2008-2009, thirteen students have submitted their theses and have completed all the requirements for the award of Ph. D degree.

Prof. L Ladushigh is the Co-ordinator for the Ph. D. programme.

**g. Master of Population Studies (Distance Learning)**

This course is of two years duration, although students have the flexibility of completing it in a maximum period of four years. In view of the increasing demand, the MPS Distance learning

course is also open to students from other ESCAP countries. Currently 485 students are enrolled for this programme. During the year 2008-2009, thirty-one students have completed all formalities for the award of MPS degree (Distance Learning).

Prof. R. K. Sinha is the Co-ordinator for the MPS (Distance learning) programme.

**h. Diploma in Population Studies (DPS) (Distance Learning)**

In view of the increasing demand, this is a new initiative started during this academic year. This course is of minimum one year duration, although students have the flexibility of completing it in a maximum period of three years. Currently 97 students, including 4 foreign

students, are enrolled for this programme. During the year 2008-2009, one student has completed all formalities for the award of DPS (Distance learning).

Prof. R. K. Sinha is the Co-ordinator for the DPS (Distance learning) programme.

### **SEMINAR PAPERS**

Towards the end of the second semester, as a part of DPS/ MPS/ M. Phil. regular course, each student is required to prepare a research paper (for DPS & MPS courses) and a dissertation (for M.Phil. course) under the guidance of a faculty member, present and defend it in a specially organized seminar participated by students (mandatory) and the faculty. These papers/dissertations are later finalised on the basis of discussions in the seminars. The seminar paper constitutes a crucial part of the teaching programme, as it contributes significantly to the development of the research potential of the students. Appendix III (Table A, B and C) provides the list of the topics of the seminar papers presented by the students during the current academic year.

### **AWARDS / MEDALS**

A student each from MPS and DPS programmes, whose overall performance adjudged to be the best, are awarded the Dr. C. Chandrasekaran Gold Medal.

A student each from DHPE and PGDCH programmes, whose overall performance adjudged to be the best, are awarded the IIPS Gold Medal.

The student, whose overall performance adjudged to be the best in the MPS (Distance learning) programme, is awarded the Dr. K. Srinivasan Gold Medal.

The student whose M.Phil thesis, adjudged to be the best, is awarded the Dr. P.N. Mari Bhat Gold Medal. This award has been initiated in memory of Prof. P.N. Mari Bhat by his parents.

A student each from from MPS and DPS programmes, whose seminar papers are rated as the best, are given the Dr. J.R.Rele award. This award is based on the paper's content; and the student's presentation and defence skill, while presenting the paper at the 'IIPS Student Seminar'.

Five IIPS Silver medals are awarded to students whose overall performance is ranked as the second best, in the respective programmes – MPS, DPS, DHPE, PGDCH and MPS (distance learning) programmes.

### **STUDY TOUR**

As a part of the academic programme, all the students of Master in Population Studies and Diploma in Population Studies were taken on a study tour for two weeks to different parts of the country. The group included one student from Laos PDR. They left Mumbai for New Delhi on 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2009 and returned back from Vadodara on 7<sup>th</sup> March 2009

During their stay at New Delhi, the students visited various organizations such as National Institute of Health and Family Welfare,

Registrar General and Census Commissioner of India, United Nations Population Fund and National AIDS Control Organization so as to get acquainted with the academic and research activities carried out by them.

At Agra, they visited B.R. Ambedkar University and Institute for Social Sciences. The students were briefed about their activities.

Then the students were taken to Jaipur where they visited the Institute of Health Management and Research. They were informed about their training and research activities. They had a brief session of interaction with State Institute of Health and Family Welfare officials.

At Chandigarh they visited the Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development (CRRID), which is an ICSSR funded research centre. They also participated in National Seminar on Population and Development in Punjab organized by IIPS Mumbai.

Then the students went to Vadodara, Gujarat. There they visited the Centre for Operation Research and Training (CORT). They were informed about their research and training activities. Students were taken to Deepak Foundation's MCH service work-site where they got the field experience of MCH services. It was a mere coincidence that in most of the places they come across at least one IIPS Alumni.

Dr. Rajiva Prasad and Dr. H. Lhugdim accompanied the students as faculty guides.

## **SHORT-TERM TRAINING PROGRAMMES**

In addition to the above courses, the Institute conducts short-term training courses on request. The following short-term training programmes were conducted during the academic year 2008-09.

1. A one month course on 'Demography, Gender and Reproductive Health' for the students from Nordic countries. From 20<sup>th</sup> July to 16<sup>th</sup> August, 2008. Twenty participants from Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland and Iceland participated in this course.

2. 'Sample Surveys and Research Methods'. From 22<sup>nd</sup> September to 3<sup>rd</sup> October, 2008. Number of participants – 23.

3. 'Application of Qualitative Methods of Data Collection in Population Research'. From 24<sup>th</sup> November to 5<sup>th</sup> December, 2008. Number of Number of participants – 10.

4. 'Construction of Life Tables and Population Projections'. During 2-6 February, 2009. Participants were 23 Probationers of Indian Statistical Service (ISS).

Dr. T. V. Sekher and Dr. Manoj Alagarajan are the Coordinators of the short-term training programmes.

5. In addition one short course on "Reproductive Health and Development" was conducted in collaboration with the Bill and Melinda Gates

Institute for Population and Reproductive Health, Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, Baltimore, USA during 12- 24 January , 2009. With Prof. Henry Mosley, Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, USA, Dr. Usha Ram organised this course.

### **iii. SEMINARS / WORKSHOPS ORGANISED BY IIPS**

#### **A. National Seminar on "Population and Development: Issues and Challenges in Punjab"**

This Seminar was organised by IIPS and the Centre for Research in Rural and Industrial Development (CRRID), Chandigarh during 3-4 March, 2009. The theme for this Seminar was related to population and health with a focus on the elderly population, demographic transition, gender, nutrition and migration in Punjab. The Seminar was inaugurated by the honourable Minister of Health (Punjab) Prof. Laxmi Kanta Chawla, at CRRID. Prof. F. Ram welcomed the delegates to the Seminar and mentioned the need for a national seminar on Punjab. Dr. Ashish Bose, Honorary Professor, Institute of Economic Growth, New Delhi, highlighted the issues related to the need for women's empowerment in correcting the adverse sex-ratio in Punjab. The changing trends in reproductive and child healthcare at the district level were discussed and the need for a separate state health policy for Punjab was highlighted.

Prof. F. Ram, Prof. B. Paswan, Dr. Chander Shekher, Dr. S.K. Mohanty and Dr. A. Chattopadhyay were the coordinators for this seminar.

#### **B. National Seminar on "Methodological Issues in Measuring Millennium Development Goals (MDG) in Districts of India"**

In order to monitor at the lowest level of policy implementation (district or lower), it becomes important to understand the quality of available data and suitable tools to arrive at indicators that would help effective assessment of the programs in general and MDG indicators in particular. However, in India, the existing methodologies and the available data at the district level are often deficient or inadequate to address some of these challenges. Hence, it was thought appropriate to organise a seminar and bring together intellectuals and experts working in related areas to discuss these issues and come up with possible solutions.

This seminar was organized by IIPS, with financial assistance from UNDP and UNFPA, New Delhi at the institute during 12-13 December, 2008. The sub-themes of the seminar were to discuss the progress of MDGs at sub-national level; Estimating Poverty; Knowledge and Utilization of SRH services; Infant and Child Mortality; Maternal Mortality; and HIV/AIDS estimation.

Prof. F. Ram, Dr. Usha Ram and Dr. S.K.Mohanty were the organisers for this seminar.

#### **C. Workshop on Indian State Basic Environmental Information Database (ISBEID)**



The Ministry of Environment and Forests, Government of India has setup a 'Population and Environment Centre' at IIPS to collect and disseminate information relating to population, environment and sustainable development. A workshop of Indian State Basic Environmental Information Database (ISBEID) was held on 18<sup>th</sup> October 2008 at IIPS, with funding from the National Informatics Centre and Ministry of Environment and Forests. Ms Valsa Nair- Singh, Principal Secretary, Government of Maharashtra inaugurated the workshop.

The following organizations participated in the workshop - Department of Environment, Govt. of Maharashtra; BNHS- ENVIS Centre, Bombay Natural History Society; Indian Centre for Plastics in the Environment, Mumbai; Solid Waste Management Association, Mumbai; ENVIS Centre, Environmental Protection Training and Research Institute (EPTRI), Hyderabad; Disaster Management Institute, Housing and Environment Department, Government of Madhya Pradesh; and ENVIS Centre, Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE).

Dr S.P. Sharma, Statistical Advisor, Ministry of Environment and Forests explained the rationale of ISBEID, and Shri S.S. Gahlout, Senior Technical Director, NIC, made a presentation of the ISBEID software and its interface with GIS.

Prof. R. B. Bhagat organised this workshop.

### **III. FACULTY RESEARCH PAPERS/ PROJECT REPORTS**

The faculty and other academic staff of the Institute prepared a number of research papers and project reports during the academic year 2008-09. In this academic year, faculty and research staffs have published a total of 56 research papers in national and international scientific journals or edited books. More than 70 research papers were presented in seminars/conferences. And more than 25 research papers are accepted for publication. During this period, the institute published 62 research project reports/ monographs/research briefs/research bulletins/fact sheets.

### **VIII. LIBRARY**

The Institute maintains an excellent library with most recent books on population and related topics.

There are 78,119 books, 13,503 bound volumes of periodicals and 16,107 reprints in the library. The library receives about 325 Indian as well as foreign journals, out of which 175 are received by way of subscription and another 150 are received by gift/exchange. More than 19,000 journal articles have been indexed and added to the library operation software. The library has books on different disciplines such as Demography, Statistics, Public Health, Family Planning, Anthropology, Mathematics, Economics, Sociology, Psychology, Health Education, Political Science, Geography, Computer Programming, etc. published by the Union Government, State Governments, Corporate Bodies, International Agencies and Commercial Publishers of India as well as abroad. The library is housed in a separate building on the first and second floors consisting of a reading hall with a seating capacity of 70 and a conference hall with a seating capacity of 40. The library provides abstract and current awareness services, documentation, reference, inter-library loan and Xeroxing facilities. The library has a special collection of all the Census Publications of India and other neighbour countries. The library is in the process of digitization of Census Volumes for the period of 1891-1941 and planning to provide access on intranet. The Institute's library provides bibliographic and reference services to other libraries, organizations and researchers and also fulfils information requests from libraries outside India.



The library is fully automated with the help of SLIM-21 software which offers Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) through a network of computers. The databases offered in the library are SCOPUS, POPLINE, JSTOR, INDIASAT.COM, PUB-Med and NUCSAL. These databases are accessible through all the computers in the campus. To promote the National Language Hindi, a bibliographical database has been made available in Devnagiri script, and is accessible through OPAC. The results can be retrieved even if the query is in English. Digital documents are accessible through a central server on intranet. The IIPS library is a Member Library of INFLIBNET Centre (Information and Library Networking of UGC), Ahmedabad.

Mr. D. D. Mestri (Library & Information Officer) is in-charge of the library.

#### **IX. COMPUTER CENTRE**

The Computer Centre of the institute is well equipped with the latest computers and statistical software required for data analysis. The computer centre is having one main classroom/lab room with 36 Pentium – IV and higher generation computers. The softwares installed on these computers are SPSS, STATA, Spectrum, Mortpac and GIS and are used by the research scholars and students for analyzing their data. Of the 36 computers, 12 computers are configured for the internet access. The computer centre has a network attached storage (Nasstor) server which stores data from Census, NFHS, RCH etc. and one email server for providing the internal email facility to the institute, the computer centre has a 1 Mbps Leased Line

connection which is distributed among the different users through Local Area Network.

To secure the internet access Fortigate Firewall is installed in the computer centre. There are total 230 desktop computers in the institute and the computer centre looks after providing the services like installation of software, configuration for the internet and local mail access and giving technical support as and when required. Recently a second classroom has been established in computer centre with 14 first generation computers to meet the requirement to run the Short Term courses and regular classes simultaneously. This second class room can also be used by students and research scholars for their research data entry and analysis.

#### **X. DATA CENTRE**

The Data Centre of the institute acquired the data set of Census of 1991 and 2001, National Family Health Survey 1 & 2, RCH (Round 1), Demographic Health Survey (DHS) and National Sample Survey (NSS) data on CD-ROM media, which are available to the researchers. An E-book in the CD-ROM media containing the full papers of DPS/MPS/M.Phil students' seminar has been prepared and six e-books on topic related to the reproductive health, child and maternal mortality are also prepared. Data sets from the National Family Health Survey 1 & 2, RCH (Round 1 & 2) are

sold to researchers who request them. At present, the users are directly accessing resources such as Demographic data sets and databases, stored on the server. Further, server based software like GIS and OPAC (Library Information) can be accessed through campus network including the internet. The users can also access Bibliographic Data Bases such as Popline, Jstor, Science Direct, Scopus, etc. The Data Centre manages and maintains websites <http://www.iipsindia.org> and <http://www.rchindia.org>. During the academic year 2007-2008 the IIPS website has been redesigned and is regularly updated.

Prof. M. Guruswamy is in charge of the Data Centre of the Institute.

## **XI HOSTEL FACILITY**

The teaching and training programmes at the Institute are fully residential. The Institute has two hostels, which are self contained, well furnished and have adequate living and working space. Computers with internet, washing machines, and LCD television are also provided exclusively for student's use in the hostel. There are 24 air-conditioned rooms at par with international standards with television and computers with internet facilities to accommodate international students and guests of the institute. There is a hostel mess run on no loss- no profit basis by a committee consisting of students, hostel staff and hostel warden. Indoor and outdoor sports facilities and a well-equipped gymnasium are also available for the use of students.
