Performance of a Skit on: 'Itni Si Baat'

Event Overview:

On March 7th, the Internal Committee of the International Institute for Population Science (IIPS), Mumbai, India, organized a skit/street play competition to celebrate International Women's Day. The event aimed to raise awareness about gender sensitization, women empowerment, and the intersection of gender and toxic masculinity. Titled 'Itni Si Baat', the skit was meticulously designed to educate, inspire, and engage the audience on these critical themes, fostering a deeper understanding of the challenges women face in their daily lives.

Skit Details:

- 3. **Public Communication Skills:** Techniques to enhance voice modulation, body language, and audience engagement were emphasized, ensuring the skit's message was conveyed effectively and powerfully.

Skit Performances:

The skit featured 11 participants who enacted various day-to-day scenes highlighting gender discrimination. The narrative was creatively woven around a conversation between a wishgranting genie and a woman, exploring her misunderstood desires. The sequences included a traffic scene, a school scene, an office scenario, and a household situation, ensuring that all aspects of daily life were covered. Each scene was thoughtfully designed to reflect the subtle and overt forms of gender bias that women encounter.

The performance was both moving and thought-provoking, showcasing the resilience and dedication of women as they navigate personal and professional challenges. The skit not only entertained but also left a lasting impression on the audience, urging them to reflect on their own attitudes and behaviors.

Audience Engagement:

The skit was preceded by a prerequisite speech by Prof. Archana K. Roy (Professor and IC Chairperson, IIPS), who set the stage by addressing the social issues highlighted in the performance. Her words provided context and deepened the audience's understanding of the themes.
