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#### Report on selection of representatives among students in the Institute

#### 1. Introduction

A committee was duly formed by the Director, IIPS to look into the selection of student representatives for each academic year to represent cultural/sports and other activities in the Institute with vide letter No. Dir/00/977/2019, dated February 7, 2019. The Committee consisting of the following faculty members was entrusted with looking into various ways in which this selection can be carried out by considering practices in other institutions and submit a detailed report stating the modalities of the selection procedure.

#### 2. Methodology/strategies adopted by the committee

With a view to accomplish above the objective, the Committee adopted a democratic method of collecting the data and information as well as the responses from students and faculty members of the Institute. The first meeting of the committee held on 12<sup>th</sup> February 2019. The members have discussed in detail about the existing student selection procedures in IIPS, in other universities/institutions, and also the guidelines of the Lyngdoh Committee. The committee after discussing different aspects of the selection process decided to meet and discuss with the students (class-wise) to understand their concerns and opinions about the selection procedure. The members were also assigned specific responsibilities starting from organizing meetings with students, taking administrative approvals, preparing a checklist for interaction with students and writing different components of the report after various consultations and interactions with the students.

#### 3. Interaction with students:

As per the decision of the first meeting, a detailed checklist/guideline was developed for the interaction with the students. The committee members interacted around one hour with each class in five batches in the Computer center on 14<sup>th</sup> Feb, 2019. The checklist prepared for the interaction is provided in Appendix-1 of this report. The number of students from all courses (MPS, MA/MSc, MBD, M Phil, PhD) participated in the meeting are as follows:

In the Institute, at present system of the student representative is prevailing. However, students have mentioned that it is very informal and held in one day. Hence a formal method is required. When students were asked whether they need an election or selection process, except MA/MSc II- year batch, all other batches expressed their views in favour of selection. They opined that, election, in an institute with a few hundred students are not required. Election requires logistic arrangement and it sometimes disturbs the academic environment. However, students have also suggested that the process of selection should be based on a close ballot system. They have also suggested having a council. The list of students who participated in the interaction is given in Appendix-2.

#### 4. Follow-up Meetings of the Committee

After the interaction with the students, The Committee further met on 18th February 2019 and 28th March 2019 and discussed the emerging issues from the interaction with the students. The committee members also discussed the issue of selection of student representatives in the faculty meeting dated 28<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Furthermore, the Committee has also examined the representation made by the student's groups to the Director about the election in the Institute.

The Committee has also examined the various election process in the universities also reviewed the analysis presented on the views of different stockholders in the Lyngdoh Committee report. The Committee members have noticed that there are two methods of election or selection of office bearers in the universities. One is based on separate office bearer selection by the direct method. On the other hand, in the indirect method, students elect or select their representatives and among them office bearers were selected. Two methods namely direct and indirect have their own merits and demerits. In organizations with only one campus, students can be selected by both the procedures. However, committee members after listening to concerns of students realized that indirect method of selection of office bearers will be better as the process of selection will be within one month of admission and all three courses students (MSC/MA, MBD, MPS) will be new in the campus and they will not be able to select the candidates directly. Moreover, in the state of Maharashtra according to University Act of 1994(40), there is no election in the universities but the selection of the students is prevailing. Although IIPS is autonomous institution under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, and being in Maharashtra it should follow the indirect method of selection of students' office bearer by forming student council first and then out of Council student office bearers may be selected. In this system of selection, students directly elect the council members in the class and they in turn shall elect the office bearers of the IIPS student representative.

The recommendation this Committee, therefore, may be categorized under the following heads:

- 2. The Processes of Selection of Student Council Members and Office Bearers
- 3. Frequency and Duration of Selection Process
- 4. Eligibility for Nomination
- 5. Disqualifications of Council Members
- 6. Functions of Student Council and Office Bearers

#### 5. Recommendations of the committee:

#### 5.1. The Need for Student Bodies

There is a need to have a structured process of the selection of the student body. The student body will represent the issues and concerns to the administrator. The Committee decided to propose a student body by a process that has a democratic representation through an effective mechanism that would ensure the voicing of grievances and the general welfare of the student populace.

#### 5.2. The Processes of Selection of Student Council Members and Office Bearers

The student representative body will be selected from regular students who are enrolled in different regular courses of the institute (Fulltime). No faculty member, nor any member of the administration shall be permitted to hold any post on the executive of such representative body, nor shall be allowed to be a member of any such representative body. During the period of the selections no person, who is not a fulltime student of this Institute, shall not be permitted to take part in the selection process in any capacity. Any person or candidate, violating this rule shall be subject to disciplinary proceedings, in addition to the candidature, as the case may be, being revoked.

**Council member**: A student council member will be formed by the selection of candidates within the class. The activity of selection will be through a secret ballot in the classroom. The nomination form (Appendix 3) will be submitted to the Academic section. Any staff of the academic section deputed by the Director along with Course Coordinators will scrutinize the nomination form along with other documents/records i.e. age, character certificate of students'. From each master's course, maximum one student (if two years course then two students) and from PhD full-time research scholars, 2 can be selected (through the ballot or own method of selection in class) for constituting the council. So there would be 8 members' council:

Council will be the supreme authority of the student representative body and shall carry on the activities of the student representative body in accordance with this prescribed rule of the Institute.

**Office Bearer:** Each selected council member will submit his/her bio-sketch (max 500 words) to the academic section within two days of his/her selection, which will be displayed on the notice board. After selecting the 8-member council, the following 5 office bearers will be selected from the 8-member council, by casting a vote. Director and Hostel Warden will supervise the process. The process should be held within a week of the selection of the council members. Process of selection will happen every year, and new candidates will be selected for all the posts.

Ex-office (i.e. the ex-general secretary of the previous year if he/she is enrolled as full-time student in the institute as per the norms mentioned in the "process of selection of representatives") will guide office bearer in different activities. However, he/she would not have any voting right on any of the Institutes approved activities of the council or Student Representative Body. These selected members will actively take part in organizing events of the Institute, abiding by Institute's rules and regulations. The office bearers can form temporary sub-committees/volunteers with approval of the Council to conduct its activities.

#### **5.3. Frequency and Duration of Selection Process**

The selections of the Council members would be held on yearly basis and that the same should be held between 4 weeks from the date of commencement of the academic session. As

per the Lyngdoh Committee recommendation, the constituted committee agreed that the entire process of selection of Council members, commencing from the date of the filing of nomination form to the time of declaration of results of Council members, should not exceed 10 days.

#### 5.4. Eligibility for nomination of council members

- a) The candidate shall be a regular, full-time student of the Institute.
- b) The maximum age limit of the nominee is 32 years.
- c) The 2<sup>nd</sup> year students of MA/MSc and MBD must have 75% attendance in the I- year.
- d) The candidates shall have only one opportunity to contest for the council, i.e. candidates who have not served the institute as a council member/secretary are eligible.
- e) The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he/she shall not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanour.
- f) The candidate shall also not have been subjected to any disciplinary action by IIPS authorities.
- g) Candidate should not have any academic backlog (arrears) in terms of an essential repeat in the last examinations.
- h) Cheating in examinations should strictly be taken under consideration to disallow such students for contesting students' selections.

#### 5.5. Disqualifications of Council Members

- a) In the case of PhD students, if he/she has completed more than 5 years or have submitted his/her synopsis.
- b) He/she has been convicted of a criminal offence, moral turpitude, or he/she has been punished, warned officially in writing by the Institute for an act which is coercive or derogatory in nature and constitutes a threat to life and property.
- c) He/she has been found guilty of and punished for the use of unfair means in any examination, official events/representations of the Institute.

It should be noted that mere verbal advice given for a student will not be deemed for the disqualification.

#### 5.6. Functions of Student Council and Office Bearers

Students are encouraged to play an active role in decision-making processes at the International Institute for Population Sciences. The Director of the Institute shall be the Patron of the student representative body. The Patron shall take all necessary steps to ensure that the council functions in accordance with this prescribed rule of the institute.

Student council generally has the primary role of liaising with Director, faculty, staff and students at the IIPS as a way of enhancing communication and student involvement in decision-making processes. Student representatives may also call student meetings/forums with prior approval from the Director, to receive and channel student perspectives through the appropriate decision-making channels at IIPS. Students representatives may consult previous year's council members to understand the modalities of the functioning of the council members. Student council should meet at least once in a month to discuss and plan future activities. Proceeding of all the meeting held by student council and minutes may be recorded by council members and followed it up in the next meeting.

Student representative body is responsible for coordinating social events for IIPS students. The selected student representative body would organize activities assigned by the institute/director namely:

- Trips and tours to places of importance.
- Foundation Day
- Sports activities
- New Year programme
- Students farewell functions
- Food festival
- Social Service Activities or any other activity suggested by the Director.

The office bearers will initiate all the activities of the institute through the council and with the help of sub-committees. Office bearers and council members should consult, discuss, and take approval with/from the respective faculty coordinators (Cultural, Sports etc.), and Director before organizing events sponsored/approved by the Institute. In the absence of any

Secretary, all other Secretaries of the student representative body will perform assigned functions.

Accounts section should share the previous year's expenditure and the approved annual budget to the respective faculty coordinators at the beginning of the academic session. Any fraudulence/unlawful action in the spending of sanctioned budget or activities observed by the faculty coordinator, warden and Director, is punishable.

Director/Institute reserves all the rights to have a correction in rules and regulation, selection process, the functioning of the student representative body, this includes council and the office bearers and the sanctioned budget. Director/Institute reserves all the rights to cancel the student representative body or keep the student representative body in a suspended animation at any time. The Director/Institute reserves the right to review the rules and regulation, the functioning of the student representative body, functioning of council and office bearers every two years.
