75 Years of India’s Independence

The touching performance had left the entire audience in amazement for a while. Last but not least, 7 students had come together to join their voices and sing in union different regional songs from that of Himachal Pradesh to Kerala and wrapping up the entire performance with Mile Sur Mera Tumhara. The sheer aesthetic of the evening was heightened by the closing group song where all the performers joined on the stage with lamps on their hand and the Indian Flag being held high, from the back.
